

Requirements for becoming a PACT LifePlan Coaching Coach

PACT LifePlan Coaches provide professional coaching, mentoring and guidance to youth in serious and/or repeat conflict with the law and middle school students aged 12-14.

Professional coaches interested in applying to become a LPC coach must:

- 1. Have completed all requirements of a coach training program at an ICF-accredited coach training school and/or already be certified by the International Coach Federation (ICF) or other reputable association
- 2. Have demonstrated life coaching experience and has some past experience working/volunteering or engaging with youth in some productive capacity
- 3. Be willing to commit to LPC for a minimum of 18-24 months, **including attending a minimum of four monthly coach meetings** <u>before</u> being assigned a client.
- 4. Be available to travel within Toronto and meet with youth clients for WEEKLY in-person coaching sessions for a minimum of one year
- 5. Be willing to attend quarterly check-ins and other important client-related meetings with parents, teachers, probation officers, the LPC program manager and others.
- 6. Be willing to document all coaching sessions and client progress in a secure online database following PACT's specific documentation requirements.
- 7. Be willing to participate/attend monthly Zoom and occasional in-person coach meetings.
- 8. Have a growth mindset and be willing to participate in occasional professional development activities, training workshops and team-building events
- 9. Complete a full Vulnerable Sector Screening Police Reference Check, sign a Confidentiality Agreement and a PACT LPC Coach Commitment and Agreement.
- 10. Adhere to all PACT general Policies and Procedures, including the specific and sensitive confidentiality and privacy requirements around working with youth in conflict with the law
- 11. Be willing to participate in the evaluation of the LPC program.
- 12. Have a caring, empathetic and genuine personality type and be a team player ready to integrate into and actively engage with the existing and supportive PACT LPC coaching community.
- 13. Provide a current resume and be available for an in-person interview.

*PLEASE NOTE: While PACT compensates at a charitable rate of \$125/hour for each weekly coaching session (as well as for other related costs such as travel and approved client expenses) there is an <u>additional volunteer</u> <u>commitment</u> required related to such things as travel time, documentation and attending monthly coach meetings.



Eligibility for being a candidate for the PACT/Adler Coach Training Bursary:

Potential candidates,

- 1) Must agree to all the criteria for becoming a PACT Life Coach besides the required training and experience.
- 2) Must demonstrate that they do not have the financial means to pay for the coach training themselves.
- 3) Must have the learning capacity, ability and stability to complete the Adler coach training and all other practicum requirements.
- 4) Must have a demonstrated interest and passion (or even better previous experience) in working with and supporting at-risk youth.
- 5) Potential candidates who have their own past similar lived experience, challenges and backgrounds as our LPC clients, is an asset.
- 6) Potential candidates who demonstrate their commitment to PACT and LPC by getting involved/volunteering in other program areas is an asset.
- 7) Must provide a current resume and be available for an in-person interview.
